Les Beattie and Roger Hardcastle could have built a dragster, but they thought the sport needed more variety so they put together a coupe with dragster muscle



ABOVE—Huge slicks on rear and small spoke wheels on front give initial hint that car is really a dragster in disguise.


BELOW-The cockpit is devoid of frills. Shoe-size go pedal and small wheel with kill button are drag standards.


